A true and perfect Terrier of the Parsonage house and Glebe lands belonging to
the Rectory of Keyston in the County of Huntingdon given August the 14th 1672
by those names are under written

Imprimis (in the first place) one Mansion house with a workhouse & bread house, A
Barne, A stable, A Hayhouse, An Orchard, little yard and a close adjoining
(adjoining) to it contayning (containing) about fower (four) Acres

Item one Glebe Close fenced ditched & quicked (describes a field boundary created by
digging a ditch and planting a live hawthorn hedge along it.) conteyning (containing) about
Thirty-three acres Christopher Biuign gent on the north and some of the arable lands
in Keyston on the south
