

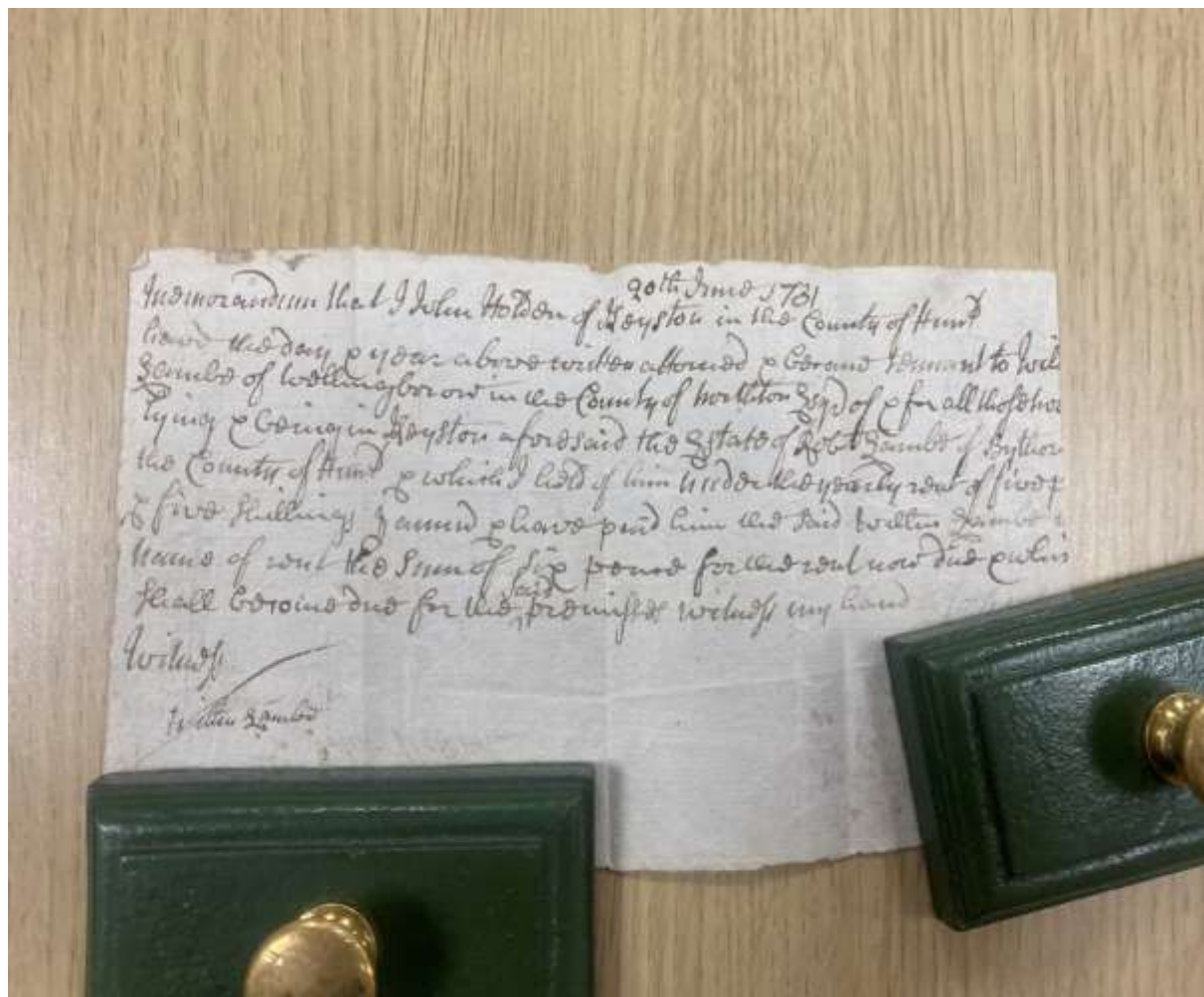
The following documents were obtained from the Huntingdon Archives on the 29th of January 2024 and related to the renting of land in Keyston by John Holden

20th June 1731

Memorandum that I John Holden of Keyston in the County of Huntingdon have the day & year above written attorned & become Tenant to Walter Gambo of Wellingborough in the County of Northamptonshire Esquire of & for all the house lying & being in Keyston aforesaid the Estate of Robert Gambo of Bythorn in the County of Huntingdonshire & which I held of him under the yearly rent of five pounds & five shillings & am & have paid him the said Walter Gambo In name of rent the Sum of Six pound for and rent now due which shall become due for the premisses witness my hand

Four years later John has agreed to take over some more land

27 April 1735

I John Holdon of Keyston in the County of Huntington do agree to attorn Tennant to William Lambe of Wellingborough in the County of Northampton Esqr for two Certain Closes in Keyston in the County of Huntington late in the occupation of Duke Emery and late the Estate of Robert Lambe of Bythorn in the County aforesaid and have paid the said William Lambe Five pound which I declare to be in the name of and as part of rent

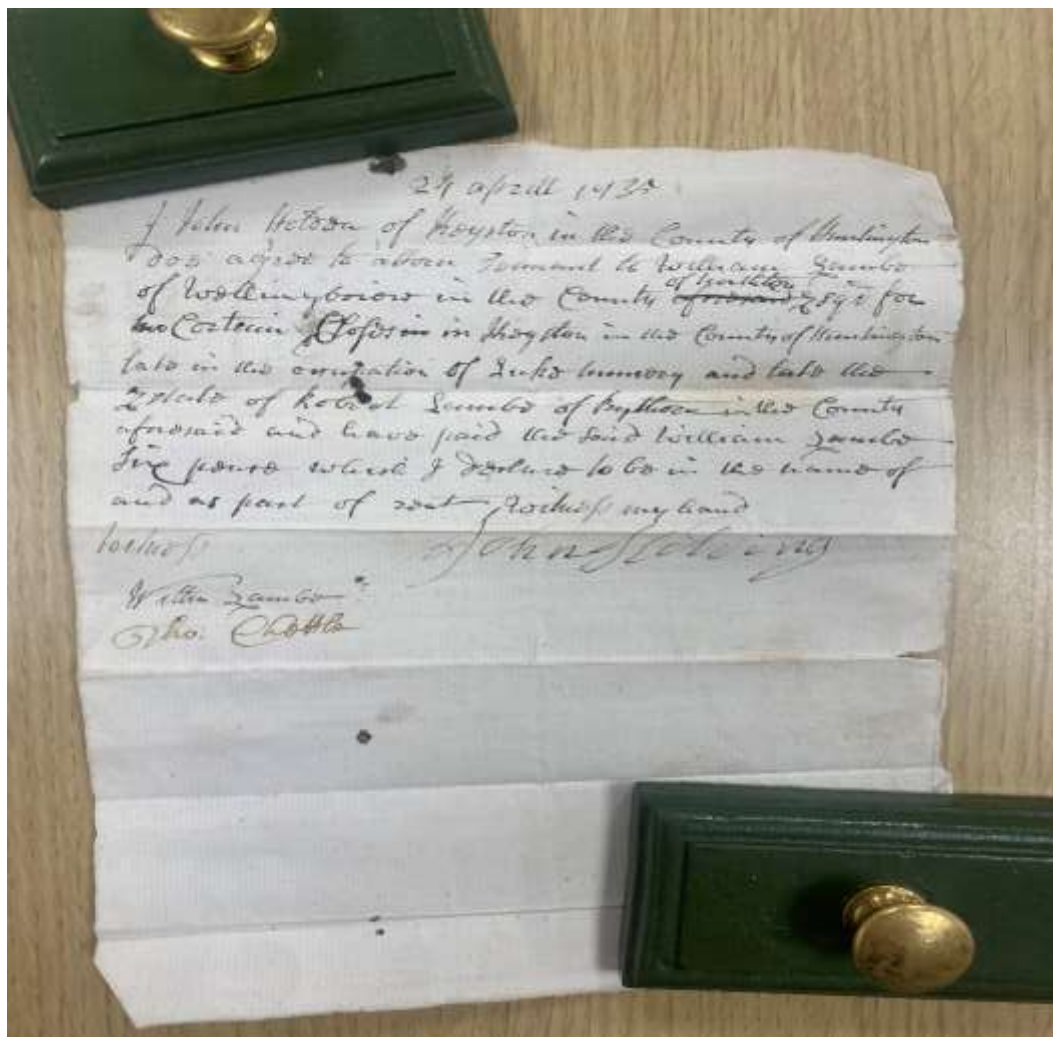
