Memorandum that I Oliver Nicklis of Keyston in the County of Huntingdonshire. have the day and year above written attorned (a tenant formally acknowledges and agrees to accept a new owner or landlord as their new property manager or lessor) and become tenant to William Lambe of Wellingborough in the County of Northamptonshire Esquire of and for the Close called Batsleys lying in Keyston aforesaid the estate of Robert Lambe of Bythorn in the County of Huntingdonshire and which I hold of him under the yearly rent of five pounds five shillings and I have paid unto the said William Lambe in the name of rent the sum of two pounds twelve shillings & six pence for half a year's rent due for the said close at Michaelmas last.
