Know all men by these present that we James Sykes of Keyston in the county of Huntingdon clerk, and Thomas Simons Churchwarden of the parish and Parish Church of Keystone aforesaid, are held & firmly bound unto the Reverend Timothy Neve D.D. Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Huntingdon Successfully appointed The sum of two hundred pounds of good and lawful money of Great Britain To be paid unto the said Dr Timothy Neve his certain Attorney, Executor, Administrator successors or assignees, to which payment well and truly to be made. we bind ourselves and both of us, our Heirs Executors and Administrators firmly by these present sealed with our seals and dated the thirteenth day of July in the year of our Lord 1751

The condition of this obligation is such that if the above bounden James Sykes and Thomas Symonds sequestrators of the Jesuits Tythes Profits oblations and all other Ecclesiastical Emoluments belonging to the Rectory of Keystone aforesaid now void; Do and shall well and faithfully sequester into their hands and safe custody, all and the Jesuits Commodities Tythes Oblations and all other Ecclesiastical Emoluments belonging to the said Rectory, for and during the now vacancy thereof, and there under safe custody and faithful Sequestration shall carefully keep, to and for the maintenance and discharge of the care of souls belonging to the said Rectory and the residence to the use and behalf of the next incumbent; And moreover do and shall procure the care of souls aforesaid during the aforesaid vacancy, to be well and sufficiently discharged; And lastly do and shall render here and faithful account of their Sequestration of the aforesaid Jesuits and Ecclesiastical Emoluments, when they shall be there unto lawfully required then their obligation to be void or else remain in full force & Virtue.
