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Edward Maria Wingfield in Anno 1635 entered into a Recognizance (is a formal legal promise made to a court, usually a pledge to return for a trial or keep the peace, backed by a financial penalty) of 1500£ to Mr George Parker which was for payment of several sums, which were not paid

In early 1655 An Elegit (judicial writ) was sued out of the Petty Bag Office (historic department of the English Court of Chancery dating from the 14th century) by virtue whereof all the remaining lands of Mr Wingfield were extended. Vide (refer to) the Elegit & Returns in the Petty bag Office Anno 1655.

To stop this extent Mrs Wingfield Widow of Bodenham Wingfield & Mr Sampson who married the only sister of Bodenham Wingfield all joined & passed to Thomas Parker the son of George Parker several lands in the occupation of Lewis Cannell & John Leay covenanting that they are 47£ per Anno but appears to be but 47£ per Anno deed is enrolled 1659

And it was further agreed that the said Edward Maria Wingfield, Mrs Wingfield & Mr Sampson should confess a Judgement of an Ejectment (a formal court ruling that restores rightful possession of real property to a plaintiff, orders the unlawful occupant to leave) of all the lands in the Extent to one John Wood upon a Lease of 30 years, which was entered accordingly. See More Farmers Office.

Which Judgmt was only to stand as a Counter Security for performance of Covenants in the Deed enrolled All which agreement is Specified in an Order of Chancery in the Cause abovesaid in Trinitie 1659 between Byron & others against Parker & others.

Upon examination of the abovementioned Recognizance entered into 1635 it was found not to be enrolled till 1647
