

The following Will was obtained from the National Archives (PROB 11/775/74) on the 27th of July 2021. And belongs to Richard Wallit, it is dated from 23rd May 1749. With it being proved on the 14th of December 1749

In the Name of God Amen, I Richard Wallit of Keyston in the county of Huntingdon Gentleman being far advanced in years and infirm in body but thanks to God of sound and perfect mind memory and understanding do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say)

Imprimis (**In the first place**) I give and bequeath unto my son Wingfield Wallit the sum of five shillings

Item I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Mary Hemmale the sum of forty pounds

Item I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Susanna Hemmale the sum of forty pounds

Item I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Jane Hemmale the sum of forty pounds

to be paid to them severally and respectively as they attain to their several and respective ages of one and twenty years

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna the wife of John Drake the sum of sixty pounds

Item all my real estate cottages messuages closes lands tenements and hereditaments whatsoever and wheresoever with their and every of their Appurtenances I give bequeath and devise to my loving son Richard Wallit and to his heirs and assigns forever

And I do hereby subject tax and charge all the real estate that descended to me by the death of my Father to and with the payment of all my just debts Legacies and funeral expenses that my assets shall or may fall short of paying and discharging

Item all my personal estate cattle goods and Chattels whatsoever and wheresoever by me before undisposed of I give and bequeath unto my above-named son Richard Wallit who I do hereby ordain nominate constitute and appoint full and sole Executor of and to this my last Will and Testament

And I do hereby revoke and make void all former and other Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made ratifying and confirming this (that is contained in this one sheet of paper) and no other to be my last Will and Testament

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the twenty third day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty-nine

I Richard Wallis of Rayson in the County of Huntington a Gentleman being far advanced in Years and infirm in Body but thanks to God sound and perfect in Mind Memory and Understanding do make this my last Will and Testament in a manner and form following (that is to say) I give and bequeath unto my Son Winfield Wallis the Sum of five Shillings from I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Mary Kemmell the Sum of forty pounds from I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Susanna Kemmell the Sum of forty pounds from I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Jane Kemmell the Sum of forty pounds to be paid to them severally and respectively as or when attain to their several and respective Ages of one and twenty Years from I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna the Wife of John Drake the Sum of sixty pounds from I give and bequeath unto my Son Richard Wallis and to his Heirs and Assigns for ever And I do hereby subject Tax and charge all the Real Estate that descended to me by the Death of my Father to and with the Payment of all my just Debts Legacies and funeral Expenses that my Executor shall or may fall short of paying and discharging from all my personal Estate Cattle Goods and Chattels whatsoever and whosoever by me before mentioned off I give and bequeath unto my above named Son Richard Wallis who I do hereby Ordain nominate constitute and Appoint full and sole Executor of and to this my last Will and Testament And I do hereby revoke and make void all former and other Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made ratifying and confirming this (that is contained in this one Sheet of paper) and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the twenty third day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty nine Rich. Wallis
